We have witnessed God's faithfulness as He has blessed our ministry. It has been our privilege to help men and women grow in leadership and responsibility, allowing - in a small scale - the Church of Christ to expand and spread the Gospel.

We encourage you to continue investing in church planting and leadership training in Quebec, where the need is great. With evangelicals comprising only about 1% of the population, compared to more than 5% Muslims, the challenge is significant.



Daniel and Isabelle Dupuis are ministering in Amos, a town in the Abitibi region where the Fellowship began its outreach in Quebec in the 1940s. There are still churches in La Sarre and Val d'Or, with more than a two-hour drive between them, and Amos is situated in the middle. Daniel and Isabelle are active members of the Val d'Or Church. We have a special connection with them, as the Lord used the Granby Church to call them as missionaries in their town, and they have been accepted as Fellowship missionaries.
